1. LOI submission. The applicant will submit□ All required materials on or before November 3, 2016
 2. Citizenship. At the time of submission, the applicant is a (One box must be checked) United States (US) citizen or permanent US resident Canadian citizen or permanent Canadian resident
3. Current research. The applicant is □ Engaged principally in basic science, translational, and/or clinical research with a proposal aimed at understanding the pathways and pathophysiology of <u>pulmonary vascular disease</u>
4. Experience. The applicant and/or the applicant's mentor have□ Experience in the proposed research field
5. Young investigator. The applicant has hadNo more than 5 years of experience beyond his/her first faculty appointment at the start of the award (as of July 1, 2017)
 6. Position. The applicant is a (One box must be checked) Junior faculty member (up to and including the rank of assistant professor) Postdoctoral scholar Doctoral candidate Fellow (Only if the fellowship will be completed prior to the start of the grant and the applicant has a pending postdoctoral or faculty appointment)
 7. Primary research training. The applicant has Completed his/her primary research training (PhD or sub-specialty fellowship training) by July 1, 2017 and have a firm commitment from their home institution for mentored career development
8. Employment. The applicant is □ Not an employee of a commercial entity (eg, pharmaceutical company)
9. Past winner. The applicant is □ Not a past ENTELLIGENCE Award winner
10. Receive award. The applicant is □ Able to receive the award directly in his/her name
 11. Institution. The research project will be carried out (Both boxes must be checked) □ At an academic institution or research institute □ In the US or Canada

If the applicant's LOI is accepted and the applicant is invited to submit a full grant, all conditions listed on the ENTELLIGENCE website, including the following, must be met
14. Grant Submission. The applicant will be able to submit □ All required materials on or before January 30, 2017
 15. Single ENTELLIGENCE application. The applicant will submit □ Only 1 research proposal to ENTELLIGENCE during the 2016–2017 round of applications (applicants who have submitted prior applications that were not funded may be eligible to submit a new application, provided they still meet the other eligibility criteria)
16. Timing. The applicant will be able to (All boxes must be checked)
 Provide documentation detailing the research project start up within 90 days following the grant award ceremony, currently scheduled for May 22, 2017
□ Commence research no later than 6 months after approval of the grant, anticipated to be July 1, 2017 (unless an alternative date for commencement has been approved by the Steering Committee)
 Complete his/her project within 12 months of commencement (clinical follow-up after the 12-month limit is allowed if properly justified by the applicant and corroborated by the outcomes and data delivered)
□ Submit a final reconciliation within 60 days of the grant's termination date
17. Mentor. The applicant's mentor will (All boxes must be checked)
 Oversee the means for adequate funding to support necessary research
□ See the project through to successful completion
 Ensure protected time for the applicant to complete his/her research Attend the ENTELLIGENCE Award Ceremony if scheduling permits
